The workshop will provide a forum for discussion of important issues related to diversity and will be held at the Hyatt Regency Washington Capitol Hill, Washington, DC. Themes of the workshop will include career and training opportunities within biostatistics. The workshop will target racial/ethnic groups who are traditionally underrepresented in the field of biostatistics. Undergraduates and faculty from undergraduate institutions are especially encouraged to attend.

Through panel discussions, current biostatistics graduate students as well as biostatistics professionals in academia, government, and industry will share their experiences and discuss topics such as mentoring, recruiting, and retaining students in related graduate programs. Also during the workshop, participants will be organized in to small groups to facilitate networking and discussion among students and professionals.
